DISPLAY YOUR ADDRESS PROPERLY

On recent tours through Midvale, we have noticed that many homes are not displaying their addresses.

Properly displaying your house numbers could save your life. If you need 911 services, fire, law enforcement and EMS will be able to find you faster.

A visitor, child or an injured person may be unable to give clear directions. New emer-

gency personnel may be unfamiliar with your area. Seconds count in an emergency!

Addresses provide identification for utility services. Phone, electric, gas, cable and other companies rely on an address to begin a new service or respond to a maintenance issue.

address clearly shown will ensure prompt delivery. Even if you rely on a post office box for mail delivery, it is important that your address be posted on your property and be visible from the road.
